The therapeutic tricycle for children with disabilities

Our AmTryke activity has been a little slow lately. We have three small Trykes in stock which are suitable for children age 2 to 4.

Good news is we have a young child trying an AM-12 with positive reports from Easter Seals. This is the bike we restored from Lincoln, Nebraska. We hope it works well for the young man. We also repaired and added a knee separator to an AM-16 to allow the young girl to more easily ride her bike. Cornbelt donated a toddler Tryke at the National Conference AmTryke Rodeo where over 30 AmTrykes were fitted and given away one afternoon. Recently, we received a \$500 donation from the Golden Kiwanis for an AmTryke. We really need to find a child who could benefit from a therapeutic tricycle and let the Golden Kiwanis know there money is being used appropriately. We will be contacting the schools again this fall and several other agencies hoping to find children who can benefit from

having their own bike. If you get a chance please check out the new AmTrykes and equipment on the new National AMBUCS[™] website. Thanks again for your help and please

continue to send me your referrals.



In June, I was very fortunate to spend 3 days at our AMBUCS[™] National Headquarters in High Point, North Carolina as part of the national scholarship committee. While there, I worked with three other chapter representatives and Janice from the home office selecting and awarding scholarships to Occupational Therapist, Physical Therapist, and Speech Therapist.

National received over 1,500 scholarship applications. Yes, we did review most of the applications. Janice did an outstanding job of organizing the materials and eliminating the ineligible ones. After the tiring process was over, we had awarded 224 scholarships totaling over \$164,000. It was lots of fun rewarding these students for their outstanding efforts at school and in their communities.

I am happy to report, both the Cornbelt sponsored scholarship applicants received National Scholarships of \$1,000 and \$750. Part of the scholarship committee's duties was to select the National Therapist of the Year. This year there were only 10 finalists, but you would have been thrilled to read their applications and accomplishments. I am not sure how some of them had time to sleep. After hearing and meeting the Therapist of the Year at National Conference recently I was assured we made the correct decision.

Thank you for allowing me this opportunity to participate and to represent Cornbelt AMBUCS[™] on an AMBUCS[™] national committee. This is a four year commitment and I am looking forward to the experience again next year.
